Narrative Activity Report

Angsamerah Workshop and Bedside Teaching for General Practitioners in the Private Sector

8-11 June 2015, Jakarta















Introduction

The narrative report at hand describes in detail the three day training workshop held at UKI private hospital, and the one day bedside teaching conducted subsequently at Klinik Yayasan Angsamerah between the 8th and 11th of June 2015. Both the workshop and bedside teaching components are part of an Angsamerah initiative called "Strengthening the Indonesian Health Workforce – A collaboration between Angsamerah, ASHM and its Indonesian professional society partners", which aims at providing general practitioners, who work in the private sector, with comprehensive basic knowledge related to the clinical management of HIV and AIDS, STI, hepatitis, tuberculosis and recreational drug use. Moreover, the comprehensive support package also aims at equipping interested general practitioners with the basics of counselling, interpersonal communication, self-motivation, and business strategy.

The workshop and bedside teaching activities have been co-funded by ASHM and endorsed and accredited by the Indonesian Medical Association (IDI). Participating doctors have also contributed towards the realization of the training package by paying a participation fee.¹

The training and support package for general practitioners is linked to Angsamerah's long-term vision of contributing to the reformation of the Indonesian health system by creating a network of 100 private clinics and practices across Indonesia (HAPPY Initiative)², providing access to quality health care to an increasing number of patients. The training program, which aligns with the national HIV program, has been endorsed by the National AIDS Commission (KPAN), the Ministry of Health, and IDI.

Relevance

Despite these recent efforts, the availability of high quality, comprehensive, friendly and affordable sexual and reproductive health and addiction services are still limited in Indonesia, resulting in suboptimal conditions for people at high risk of contracting HIV and STIs, those already suffering from it, and or dealing with addiction problems. Recent year's efforts to expand these services, and health programs for the Indonesian health workforce to manage these issues introduced by the Indonesian government, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), the Indonesian Medical Association

(IDI) and other health professional organizations have mainly been focused on public health providers at public health centers (puskesmas) and public hospitals. General practitioners and other health providers within the private sector, in particular those focusing on the primary health care level, have not been mobilized sufficiently.

Poor quality, lack of privacy, long waiting periods and short consultation times at public services have led many people, especially from the growing middle class, to seek services from private health care providers. Furthermore, a considerable part of the population, including many individuals at 'high-risk' of HIV and other STIs, are not accessing any services for their sexual and reproductive health. While reasons for this are complex and diverse it is partly due to poor knowledge of sexual and reproductive health issues and or because they do not trust in or are dissatisfied with the quality of existing services.

With health problems related to HIV and AIDS, STIs, hepatitis, tuberculosis and drug use on the increase in Indonesia, it is crucial for general practitioners and other health care providers in the private sector to be informed and have the ability to recognize these conditions in their patients as early and accurately as possible. This will allow doctors to diagnose, care and treat patients (and if required refer them to specialized services) promptly and accurately.

ASHM and Angsamerah have long recognized the viral role of the private health sector in filling existing gaps. Based on Angsamerah's track record of creating strong models of sexual health care delivery and being a satellite provider of ART, in January 2013, ASHM has thus started collaborating with Angsamerah Institution with the purpose of maximizing ASHM's contribution to its partners and members in Indonesia, particularly the Indonesian Medical Association (IDI).

The project "Strengthening the Indonesian Health Workforce – a collaboration between Angsamerah, ASHM and its Indonesian professional society partners" aims to increase the capacity of general practitioners in the private sector to diagnose, care and treat health conditions related to SEX, HIV & DRUGS, and is part of the DFAT Regional HIV Health Care Capacity Development Program 2014-2015.

Workshop

The three day workshop titled "Practical Lessons: Clinical Management (SEX, DRUGS & HIV), Interpersonal Communication, and Business Strategy in Primary Health Care Services, for General Practitioners in the Private







Sector", has been successfully conducted between the 8th and 10th of June 2015 at UKI private hospital in East Jakarta. The workshop constitutes the first of several components of a comprehensive support package for general practitioners, which includes both theoretical and practical aspects. A similar workshop for general practitioners, lasting two days, has been conducted in collaboration with ASHM and IDI in July 2014.

A total of 12 doctors participated in the workshop, which engaged a wide range of experienced national experts on HIV and AIDS, STI, HIV and hepatitis co-infection, HIV and tuberculosis co-infection, addiction medicine, gender and sexuality, counselling, communication and self-motivation. The workshop had been structured along three thematic and methodological blocks, each lasting one day:

Day 1 – Focus on Communication, Counselling, and Self-Motivation:

On the first day of the workshop, after a short opening speech from Dr. Rosma Napitupulu, Director of UKI hospital, and a presentation by Dr. Dyah Waluyo about the role of IDI and other professional organizations in relation to private practitioners, HIV, SEX & DRUGS, the bulk of the day was reserved to equip participating doctors with the basics of interpersonal communication and counselling, as well as self-motivation and goal setting. These so called soft skills are often neglected but are as important for health professionals as clinical skills and knowledge. The three sessions "Steps of Positive Character Building" (self-motivation and goal setting), "Basics of Interpersonal Communication", and "Basic Counselling" were delivered by a team of skilled experts from Angsamerah.

Participants learned, among other things, that good communication skills³ are pivotal to a successful and rewarding practice. Health providers need to be able to communicate well and clearly with clients (patients), staff, partners, associates, and stakeholders. Particularly when dealing with patients who suffer from conditions related to SEX, HIV & DRUGS, which are very private and culturally sensitive issues, good communication skills are key. Good communication skills allow a doctor to express himself/herself with more confidence, allow patients to understand complex medical issues and their situation, which will not only have a positive impact on the diagnosis, care and treatment of a given medical condition, but also attract more clients and allow for better collaboration with referral sources. This in turn will lead to a more profitable and enjoyable practice, because clients that a doctor communicates with well will trust and like their doctor and are thus more likely to return.

Day 2 – Focus on Clinical Aspects: HIV and AIDS, STI, hepatitis, tuberculosis and recreational drug use:

Comprehensive and up-to-date clinical knowledge related to HIV and AIDS, STIs, hepatitis, tuberculosis and addiction problems are vital for any competent general practitioner in today's world. However, in reality, many general practitioners, both in the private and public sectors, still lack comprehensive knowledge in this regard.

Therefore, the second day of the workshop dealt with a wide variety of clinical issues related to SEX, HIV & DRUGS, delivered by renowned national experts. But before diving into the world of medicine, participants were provided with an introduction into sexuality and gender, which is fundamental knowledge for doctors dealing with clinical issues related to SEX, HIV & DRUGS. This first session was followed by six interactive presentations about clinical issues: 1) "Drugs, addiction, and over dose management in primary care"; 2) Role of general practitioners in private sector for HIV program in Indonesia; 3) HIV management in primary care; 4) Tuberculosis and HIV; 5) Introduction Co-Infection HIV and Hepatitis B & C; 6) Sexually Transmitted Infections – Diagnosis and Treatment: Individual Approach and Public Health Perspective.

Day 3 – Focus on Praxis: Case Study (Clinical) and Business Strategy

On the third and last day of the workshop, the focus was laid on practical aspects, allowing participants to draw from their professional experience and to apply their newly gained knowledge and skills during a number of interactive case study discussions delivered by facilitators from UKI hospital, Infectious Disease Hospital Sulianti Saroso, and Angsamerah.

A total of five cases were discussed during this session:

- 1) Case related to drug use (methamphetamine) delivered by Dr. Ayie Sri Kartika
- 2) IRIS in HIV infection by Dr. Donie Lumban Gaol (UKI Hospital)
- 3) Toxoplasmosis in HIV infection by Dr. Donie Lumban Gaol (UKI Hospital)
- 4) HIV and Tuberculosis co-infection by Dr. Adria Rusli (Sulianti Saroso Infectious Disease Hospital)
- 5) HIV and Syphilis co-infection by Dr. Stanislaus Bondan (Angsamerah)

The participating doctors were enthusiastic about the case study discussions, participated actively and asked many critical questions. Some proofed to be very knowledgeable and skilled in their approaches to solve the cases. The case studies served as valuable teaching material, demonstrating both classical and unusual presentations which may confront the practitioners in their professional lives.







After lunch, during the last two sessions of the workshop, participants were provided with basic knowledge related to business management and strategy. Particularly doctors who work in the private sector running their own private clinic or practice need to have at least basic knowledge about how to manage a private clinic business and in business strategy. However, many doctors lack these skills, which prevents them from earning a decent living and growing their businesses. The participating doctors listened with great interest to Dr. Nurlan Silitonga, who shared her knowledge, insights and advice during a session titled "Entrepreneurship skills for doctors", making many references to her journey establishing the two Angsamerah private clinics and Angsamerah Institution. Dr. Nurlan Silitonga also delivered a session about "Personal Branding", encouraging participants to be self-confident and take ownership of their personal and career paths and reach for their dreams.

All workshop participants received a certification (15 Credit Points) from the Indonesian Medical Association (IDI).

Methods and Speakers

The workshop was delivered by using interactive and practical methods, such as presentations, discussions, and case studies. Guest speakers consisted of a wide range of experienced national experts on HIV and AIDS, STI, HIV and hepatitis co-infection, HIV and tuberculosis co-infection, addiction medicine, gender and sexuality, counselling, communication and self-motivation.

Bedside teaching

On June 11, after the completion of the three day workshop at UKI Hospital, a one day bedside teaching training had been organized at Klinik Yayasan Angsamerah. Two of the doctors who had attended the workshop also participated in the bedside teaching component - both of them dentists with no previous experience handling patients with conditions related to SEX, HIV & DRUGS. They were guided and instructed by a team of Angsamerah doctors, consisting of Dr. Nurlan Silitonga, Dr. Stanislaus Bondan, Dr. Lamsaria, and Dr. Jacqueline R. Piay.

Before seeing any patients, the two participating doctors learned in theory about the process of anamnesis, genital examination, testing procedures,







how to open and communicate test results, treatment of different STIs, the usage of anoscopy and speculum, how to take a sample, fixation, staining, and laboratory analysis.

For the bedside teaching patient-based teaching six patients were invited to the clinic, referred by two partnering Civil Society Organizations (CSOs). Each patient was provided with free testing and paid a small incentive. Three of the patients were men who have sex with men (referred by Yayasan Inter Medika), and the other three patients were female sex workers (referred by Yayasan Kapeta).

The three male patients were all tested for HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea and chlamydia (urethra and anus). The first patient was handled by the Angsamerah doctor (Dr. Stanislaus Bondan) and the two learning doctors watched. The second and third patient were then each handled by one of the two learning doctors. The patients' diagnosis were as follows:

- Patient 1 (MSM): Healthy.
- **Patient 2** (MSM): Diagnosed with urethral gonorrhea, treated with ceftriaxone intramuscular.
- **Patient 3** (MSM): Diagnosed with HIV and genital warts around anus, patient underwent post-test counselling related to HIV diagnosis and new appointment for CD4 and base line testing was arranged. The genital warts were treated on-site with podophyllin.

The three female patients underwent vaginal discharge and Pap smear testing. The first patient was handled by the Angsamerah doctor (Dr. Lamsaria) and the two learning doctors watched. The second and third patient were then each handled by one of the learning doctors. The patients' diagnosis were as follows:

- **Patient 1** (FSW): Diagnosed with cervicitis (non-gonorrhea), treated with azythromicyn 500mg and cefixim 400 mg.
- **Patient 2** (FSW): Healthy.
- **Patient 3** (FSW): Diagnosed with cervicitis (non-gonorrhea), treated with azythromicyn 500mg and cefixim 400 mg.

Overall, the bedside teaching as a patient-based teaching method proved to be very successful, as various aspects of clinical practice could be demonstrated and learned. The participating doctors could be provided with a unique opportunity to improve their clinical diagnostic skills, as well as communication skills in relation to the issue of sexuality, and communication of test results.







All bedside teaching participants received a certification (8 Credit Points) from the Indonesian Medical Association (IDI).

Finance

Workshop:

Total costs related to the three day workshop were of Rp. 79'678'800. This already includes Angsamerah's investment, which is of Rp. 28'250'000 and has not been paid in real (fee for Angsamerah facilitator and event coordinator, goody bags, media design, proposal development and report writing).

Bedside teaching:

Total costs related to the bedside teaching training were of Rp. 8'045'000. This already includes Angsamerah's investment, which is of Rp. 2'400'000 and has not been paid in real (fee for Angsamerah doctors, laboratory technician and nurse, event coordinator).

The grand total of both the workshop and bedside teaching (excluding Angsamerah's investment, which is of Rp. 30'650'000) is of **Rp. 57'073'800**.

- ASHM provided a total of Rp. 50'060'000 (AU\$ 5'000) of funding towards the two activities.
- Participators' fees were of a total of Rp. 13'200'000.
